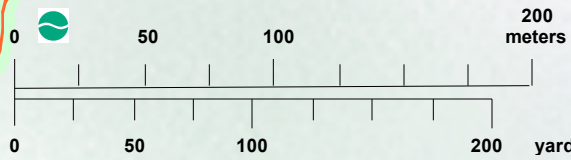
TRAIL LENGTHS

Luna Loop		.9K (.5M)
Paradise Loop		1.4K (.9M)
Madelyn's Meadow		.9K (.5M)
Easiest Loop		2.0K (1.2M)
Sitzmark		.5K (.3M)

There are rules of the trails that keep everyone happy:

- Please do not walk on the groomed ski trails
- Dogs are not recommended
- Let tracks set up before using; it takes 2-4 hours for the freshly groomed tracks to set up
- Follow trail direction; keep to the right on two-way trails
- Give way to skiers going downhill
- Mountain bikes and snowmachines are prohibited
- Join the Seward Nordic Ski Club to support cross-country skiing!
